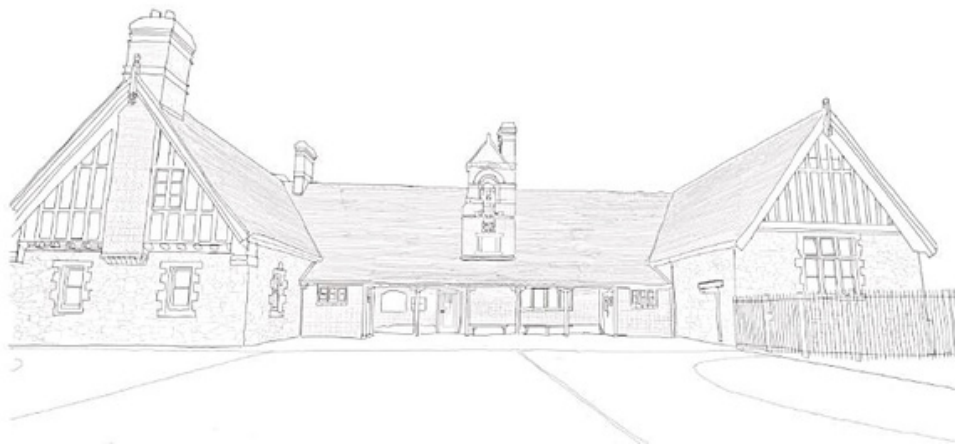

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Welcome to Viscount Beaumont's Church of England Primary School

We wish you a very warm welcome to Viscount Beaumont's Church of England Primary School.

We hope that this prospectus will provide a snapshot of life at our school.

Our school is situated in the village of Cole Orton (known as Coleorton) is one of the most beautiful villages of Leicestershire and has approximately 80 children on roll.

Viscount Beaumont's CE (Aided) Primary School was established and endowed by Viscount Beaumont in 1702, and was rebuilt by Canon Beaumont in 1867. Since then it has been extended and modernised but many of the original attractive features remain.

Today the school is a co-education Primary Day School.

The school is located in large pleasant grounds surrounded by countryside. Our outside area has a number of outdoor play facilities including a forested area, a trim-trail, a large sports field and a quiet garden. Inside our school we have a beautiful old hall, small group rooms, a library, classrooms and a computer suite. All of the classes are bright and welcoming with interactive whiteboards. Children have access to computers in our dedicated suite as well as a bank of iPads to use in class and outside.

Viscount Beaumont's Primary School is part of the RISE Multi Academy Trust, this is a family of schools who work with and for each other. The vision and values of RISE show how there is great importance on what the Trust do and how they do it. Their values underpin interactions with each other and strengthen the sense of family, children are placed at the heart of everything that is done. The RISE team of staff are skilled, hardworking and committed to developing all of your child, not just their academic ability. The trust recognises that success for every child will be different and that is celebrated.

'Where the child is at the heart...' encapsulates our vision and all that we do. We truly believe that when children enjoy coming to school that they will thrive and flourish into confident, independent and successful children, young people and beyond.

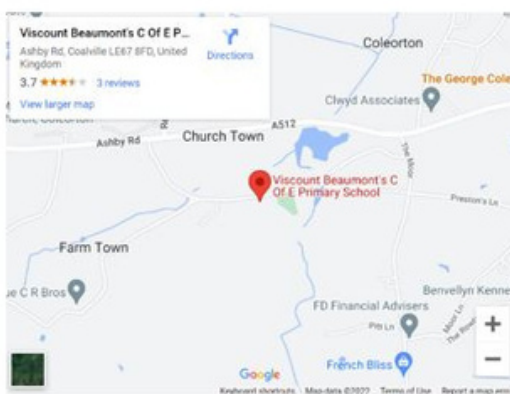


Our Location

Starting School

Our school admits children on a full time basis at the beginning of the school year in which they are five. All pupils are expected to attend school on a full time basis after an initial induction period, during which parents and children are encouraged to become familiar with the surroundings and routines of our school.

Sometimes children join our school during the term and then every effort is made to ensure they are welcomed and integrated as quickly as possible into our school community. However, if a child should have any problems settling in, parents and carers are asked to contact the school early on, so that we can work together to resolve the situation.

All children within the school catchment area are eligible for admission provided that an application is made to the Local Authority (LA) via their website (details below). Our Published Admissions Number is 16. Our designated catchment area does not prevent parents who live outside this area from expressing a preference for our school.

Wraparound Care (Before and After School Clubs)

Clubs are run before and after school EVERY DAY!

We are very fortunate in the fact that here at Viscount Beaumont's School, we are able to offer childcare before and after school. Our clubs are provided by ClubsComplete who assist many Primary Schools throughout the UK with excellent extra-curricular services. All their staff are fully DBS checked and trained in first aid.

They provide before and after school care. This is from 7:30am in the morning and until 6pm.

As well as Clubs Complete we also offer a range of different clubs throughout the academic year including sports clubs and Forest School.

Our Curriculum

Our exciting and aspirational curriculum is based on the statutory requirements of the National Curriculum along with the non-statutory guidance on PSHE and Citizenship and the Locally Agreed Syllabus for RE.

We work hard to ensure that all teaching and learning is engaging and relevant to pupils, further information about the curriculum for each year group can be found on the school website under the Information tab.

We also offer a wide range of sports activities beyond the statutory PE curriculum and children are able to join clubs and teams to develop their physical skills. We work with accredited coaches from North West Leicestershire School Sports Partnership who work with our staff and pupils to develop skills and technique.

Supporting your Child

INCLUSION

As a school we strongly oppose racism and discrimination in any form. We promote equal opportunity for all and our policies are inclusive to ensure we all work together to promote a deep understanding of the rich diversity of cultures in today's society. We carry out an accessibility audit each year and are confident we can meet the diverse physical and educational needs of our pupils. No pupil will be declined admission on the basis of disability. We work with a range of outside agencies to ensure the needs of disabled pupils are fully met and this is reviewed annually in consultation with parents.

Please inform us if you or your child has a disability which may make access to any part of the school or curriculum difficult so we can ensure all reasonable adjustments are made.



SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS AND DISABILITY (SEND)

The Governors and staff work hard to ensure that children with SEND have access to a fully inclusive curriculum and can take part in everyday activities. We will always consult parents if we feel that a child needs special support with learning and parents are encouraged and helped to express their views and all staff work towards supporting these children effectively and boosting their self-esteem.

SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN

Children with SEND will receive specific help from their class teachers, the SEND co-ordinator and learning support assistants. Where necessary, the school and parents will consult with and receive advice from various outside agencies. The progress for children with SEND is assessed and reviewed and individual or group education plans are produced accordingly.

PASTORAL CARE

Effective pastoral care depends on mutual respect, confidence and understanding between home and the school. We aim to motivate children through praise and reward for good behaviour, but have a scale of sanctions, which we can use for children who misbehave, if necessary. If your child's behaviour is causing concern at school, you will be informed and invited to discuss the way forward with the class teacher.

We believe that it is important to encourage every child:

- To understand that the school community depends on the co-operation and goodwill of all
- To understand the need for self-discipline and acceptable behaviour
- To think of the needs of others
- To show good manners.

Parental Involvement

We strongly encourage parents and carers to be involved in our school in a variety of ways. Each class holds a termly assembly or open classroom to showcase their learning and there are also the weekly celebration assemblies.

Twice a year parents are invited to attend an appointment with class teachers to discuss their child's progress and attainment and all staff are available at the end of each day.

Further opportunities are available to parents want to become more involved, we have an active PTFA who are always looking for more support or you may wish to become a governor at the school.

If you ever need to speak to your child's teacher, the best time to do this is at the end of day when the children come out of school, if a message needs to be passed to a teacher first thing in the morning you can discuss it with a member of staff in the playground or visit the office. You could also ring or email during the day and a teacher will always ensure they get back to you within 24 hours.

Our teachers also use a messaging system called Class Dojo. You can message your child's teacher on Dojo for any non-urgent matters and they will get back to you within 24 hours. Any urgent matters including a change in who is collecting your child on the same day must go through the office.



REPORTING TO PARENTS

A positive and supportive link between home and school can help your child come happily to terms with two very important parts of their life. Your child will learn more readily in the secure and happy environment that such a link can provide. We will keep you informed about your child's progress and of any concerns we might have. Please let us know of any factors at home that might affect your child during the day. As well as the twice-yearly appointments with your child's class teacher, we also produce an annual report which is sent at the end of the summer term.

Food and Drink

We promote healthy eating and ask that children bring either a piece of fruit for their morning snack. We are a member of the School Fruit and Vegetables Scheme and so pupils in EYFS, Year 1 and 2 are offered free fresh fruit at break-time. We are a “no nuts” school, and kindly ask that nuts and sesame are not brought into school. Cooled water is available to the children during the day but we advise each child also brings a water bottle too.

Milk is available to all pupils via the Cool Milk Scheme. This is free for all under-fives and subsidised for pupils aged five and over. If you would like your child to have milk, please register at www.coolmilk.com/register

At lunchtimes children eat either a packed lunch or a hot meal in the school hall. All hot meals are cooked in our own kitchens daily and children in EYFS, Year 1 and are entitled to free dinners. Dinners are payable from year 3 unless you are eligible for free school meals. We would ask that dinners are always paid for in advance, whether this be weekly, monthly or even termly.

At Viscount Beaumont's, you choose whether your child eats packed lunch, hot school dinner or a mixture of both throughout the term.

DROPPING CHILDREN OFF AT SCHOOL AND COLLECTING THEM

Please do not park in the school car park. If parking on the main road, please be considerate of our neighbours and avoid blocking their access. You may like to consider walking or cycling with your child to school, if there is a safe route. Children must wear a helmet if they cycle to school. Cycle and Scooter racks are provided. At home-time you are invited to stand and wait for your child/ren inside the school grounds. Gates will be open five minutes before the end of the day.
